This action toolkit provides information on two essential rights for persons arrested by law enforcement officers:
$\checkmark$ the right to inform someone about their arrest the right to be informed about their rights

Arrested persons also have the right to:
$\checkmark$ Be treated with respect and dignity. Officers cannot subject anyone to any form of violence.
$\checkmark$ Remain silent. Officers cannot force anyone to answer their questions or confess.
$\checkmark$ Notify a relative or friend about the arrest and the location of the detention.
$\checkmark$ Contact and consult a Lawyer.
Be seen by a medical professional.
Be assisted by an interpreter, if needed.

what should happen to me when i am arrested?


- I must be treated with respect and dignity.
- I must be told the reasons for my arrest.
- I must be informed about my rights immediakely.
- I must be taken to an official police station immediately.
- I must be transported in an appropriate police vehicle.
- My entry into the place of custody is recorded.
- I must be informed about the reasons for my arrest immediakely.
- I must be informed about my rights immediately.
- I must be assisted by an interpreter, if needed.
- I must be allowed to contact a person of my choice immediately.
- I must be allowed to consult a lawyer in private.
- I must be examined by a medical professional, if I so request.
- I musk be kept in adequate and hygenic conditions.
- I must be provided with enough food, waker, clothing, and, if needed, bedding
- I must be allowed to communicate with and receive visits from persons outside.
- I must be allowed to make a complaint about my arrest or treatment, if I so request.
- I must be taken to a court for judicial review of my detention.
- I must be able to inform a judge about how I have been treated.
- I must be assisted by a lawyer.
- I must be assisted by an interpreter, if needed.
